If you can't make it, they'll also be at the **Ōhaupō Memorial Hall from 6pm-8pm** that evening to speak with residents.

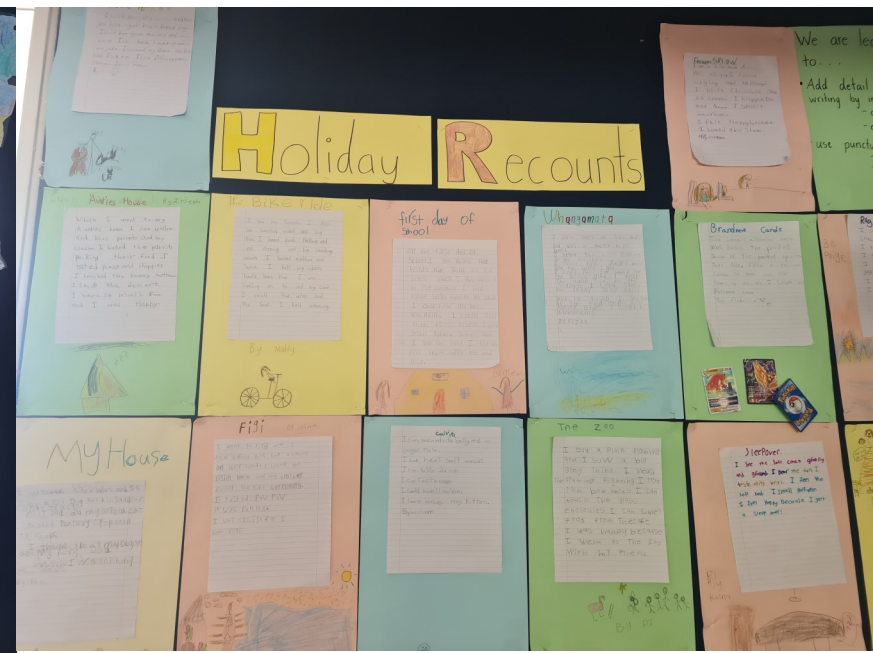
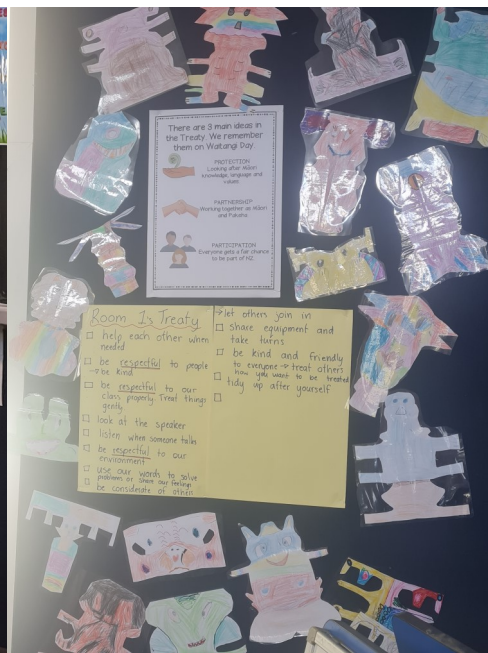

Kia ora Parents/Whanau,

The students have had a great two weeks. They are following our class routine which looks like this:

- First block English Curriculum - phonemic awareness, alphabet knowledge, oral language development, reading, writing and task board activities. Our alphabet letters for the next two weeks are: **e n o d g l v y r h**. **We focus on a letter a day as well as revisiting letters from previous learning.**
- After morning tea: Maths Curriculum - number knowledge and number strategies at present. **We are learning to count forwards and backwards within 30, also identifying numerals plus identifying numbers before and after a given number. Most students are working on their number formation.**
- After lunch: Health & PE Curriculum - aquatics. We are focusing on floating.
- The Arts Curriculum - art or drama or music/ Technology - creating/designing.

Our Maori Curriculum is woven throughout different curriculum areas and we have started to introduce some Maori legends. The students have shown a keen interest the legends and they are gaining confidence using te reo. We hope you liked the eels that came home on Friday.

You may have noticed the caterpillars in our room - this has created huge discussions and the sharing of knowledge.

Home Learning

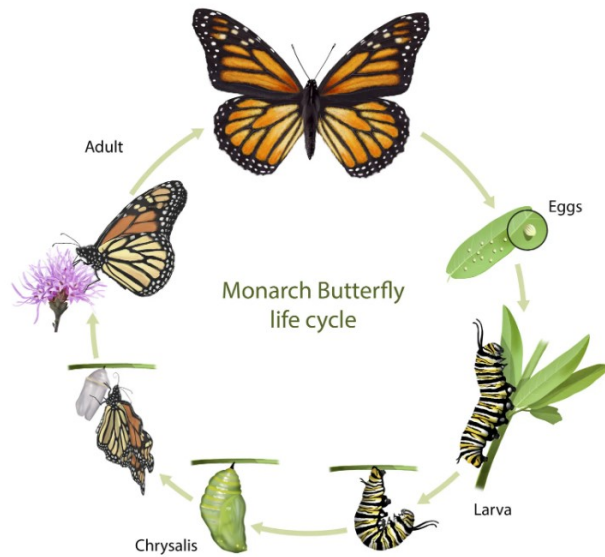
