In Room One we have been learning all about taniwha and the different legends that surround them. We have learnt that some taniwha are seen as kaitiaki (guardians) of their water homes and others are known to be rather fierce and dangerous. We have had a taniwha song as our poem last week and this week have enjoyed reading the big book, 'Bunyip in the Billabong'. The students have had lots of fun reading aloud the interesting bold words with expression and enjoyed reading different parts of direct speech for the characters. We have also created our own taniwha and wrote to describe them using lots of interesting describing words and similes. Feel free to pop in and see these on display next week.



Room 2 has been learning about the mountains and water in our area. This week we created our very own Waikato River for our class. We worked together to make the river and the creatures inside it. We even wrote some amazing writing about what we have learnt so far. The students had to include adjectives when describing the river. We learnt about how it starts out beautiful and clear in Taupo, then is brown when it gets to Hamilton.



We also had a special visit from Brad. He brought in his V8 racing ute into school. The kids loved this experience. They all sat in the ute and asked lots of interesting questions. Room 2 loved it when he started the ute "it's so loud!" "This is the best thing ever!" We had lots of excited children on Tuesday.

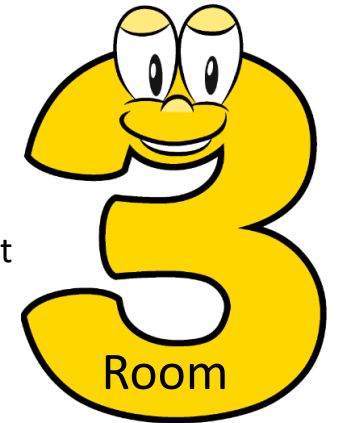
Last week the students had a great time with Mrs Esselbrugge learning about rocks; how you get iron out of sand with magnets; how pumice is made (and how to make hokey pokey); the Brazil Nut effect (using rice and marbles), and the big eruption of Lake Taupo. If your child hasn't come home talking about the class book they are reading, "Crown Park", by Des Hunt, ask them to tell you about it and it's connection to the eruption of Lake Taupo.

This is our last week swimming and we are looking forward to spending more time with our maths. This is our last week of addition and subtraction and then we will be starting on multiplication and division. We will have a quick recap of the 2, 5 and 10 timestables and then we will be focussing on the 3, 4 and 8 tables. Watch out in their homework books for some practice sheets.

Laptops are going to be needed again in class from Monday 11th as we start a new inquiry. Watch this space for more details next newsletter.

In Room 4 the last couple of weeks we have finished up our Native bird learning and art pieces (these are on display in the office) and we are now moving on to volcanoes and how they created the shape of New Zealand as we know it now.

For Maths, we have been concentrating on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1,000.

In our reading groups, the students have been working on finding the purpose of the text and collecting evidence to decide if the text is a trustworthy source of information.

This reading focus and Inquiry subject ties in nicely to our current writing project which is to write a report on a New Zealand Volcano, the students will be working towards publishing this writing and displaying it on our classroom walls along with a miniature sculpture of the volcano they have studied.

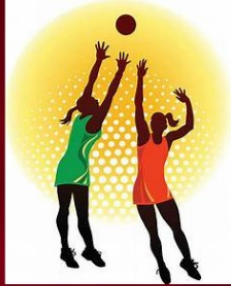
