# What are we learning?



Over the last week, we wrapped up our science inquiry -Floating and Sinking. Each student came up with their own investigation and carried out their experiments. They then developed simple expalanations on how and why objects float and sink based on density, volume, and mass. Following this, they put their explanations in a sequence, accompanied by a sequence of hand drawn pictures demonstrating their success. These are on display in our classroom.

## Volcanoes!

We did an experiment which involved baking soda and vinegar mixed together to make a gas called carbon dioxide. With the awesome creations of Nina, Texas, Tamai, and Fenn's volcanic mountains, room 1 and room 6 got to see what a volcano looks like when it erupts from the earths surface as lava.


