
AG Day will be held on 17th October and Group Day will be on 24th October



Mathematics: Right & Responsibilites Perimeter, Area and Volume **Weekly Focus:** Health & PE:

Ownership of our learning

Writing: Similes, Metephors and Revisiting our writing.

Endurance running

Reading: Understanding the authors purpose

This Week's Focus: Taking ownership of our learning.

Building on our Inquiring studies looking at our Rights and Responsibilities within the world, we are acknowledging the fact that we all have the right to an education, which comes with the responsibility of putting in the effort required to get the most out of it.

This week in Room 5 during mathematics we have been learning how to work out the perimeter and area of various shapes. This learning will lead us into understanding the space a 3 dimensional shape occupies and how to calculate its volume. This knowledge will be applied to working out the perimeter, area and volume of our very own architecture designs moving into Week 7 and 8.

During reading we have been focusing on non-fictional text, specifically articles. We are being challenged to question why a specific article has been written, who is the target audience and what is their hidden agenda within, if any. This learning is helping us understand the purpose of articles and how they can be used to push an idea in a particular direction, for good or for bad, but to really question what side the author is supporting.

In writing a primary focus has been mastering the skill of revisiting and revising our writing. We are learning the art of putting our ideas on paper and then skillfully recrafting them in to a piece worthy of publishing, but most importantly producing a piece of writing we are proud of due to the level of thought and effort we have applied. We are also being challenged to incorporate similes and metaphors that are more than just a surface feature. Our goal is to include similes and metaphors that truly shape our writing and add some effect for our readers.

#### **Health and Physical Education**

This week, while competing against the weather, we have been doing the infamous Beep Test to increase our endurance abilities in running. Whilst pushing ourselves to go further each time we attempt this test, we are also learning ways to work through the dreaded stitch while running, the skill of setting a good pace and sticking with it, while also enjoying watching classmates push themselves to new levels within the Beep Test itself. Kalani is Room 5's champion, reaching Level 8 on Wednesday. We can't wait to see him compete in the school's cross country this Friday... if the weather allows him.
