A third of our students got behind this and collectively they raised \$1736.00


The amounts raised went directly of their own camp fees.




# ROOM 2 NEWSLETTER

# ROOM 4 CLASS NEWS

### A note from the teacher:

Room 4 Update: Exploring Maths, Writing, and the Human Body! In the last two weeks, Room 4 has been engaging in hands-on learning activities to deepen their understanding of math concepts. We measured the court using chalk and one-meter rulers to grasp the concept of area better. This exercise helped the students realize the practicality of using a simple formula for quicker calculations in the future. Taking this a step further, we measured the school swimming pool to calculate how many cubic meters of concrete would be needed to fill it. This was an exciting way for students to learn about calculating volume. Our math focus has been on perimeter, the area of rectangles and triangles, and the volume of rectangular and triangular prisms.

In writing, we've just wrapped up our narrative unit and have moved on to writing color poems. The students have been using fancy color names from paint samples to create their masterpieces. Next, we will be focusing on writing persuasive speeches as they prepare to convince their peers why they would make great class leaders for Term 4.

Let's see if Room 4 can pass this challenge: As part of our inquiry into the human body, we've been learning about the names of our bones. When you see your child next point to a bone in their body and see if they can name it! Our upcoming focus will be on muscles.

### This Week's Focus:

We have officially moved back in to our classroom and boy it feels great to be home. The roof may seem lower and the walls are closing in on us but the spirits and learning ethic within those four walls has never been bigger. Both students and teacher are excited about the learning coming our way at full speed and the expectations that come along with this.

Volume may have been explored through the sound of the teachers voice bouncing off the walls of the hall in past weeks, but this week it is taking on new forms. Student's are learning about calculating the volume of rectangular and triangular prisms along with cones, cylinders and spheres. The calculators are out and the kids are feeling like real high-school students as they dive deep in to this new learning. Speaking of "diving", lets work out the volume of the school pool while we are at it.

Monuments of the World is our Inquiry focus at the moment. While students research and learn about various structures around the world along with some on our backdoor step here in New Zealand, students of Room 5 are learning some topic specific words and some interesting facts that have left their jaws on the floor as they appreciate the share size of these incredible monuments and the purpose of their construction.

We have all become reporters! The students of Room 5 will be constructing a Rukuhia School Newspaper which will dive deep in to topics close to their hearts and of high interest of the students of Rukuhia School. Each student has designed a plan of attack and will be interviewing and researching various topics such as 'What is really on Mr Drurys computer?', 'What do teachers get up to at home?' and 'The history of Rukuhia School 50+ years ago'. Watch this space as I have high hopes it will be something incredible we will ALL want to read.


