Last week, our class dove into our learning about animal adaptations. We've spent time with Dave, the rescue duckling, who has helped us explore how animals adjust to their environments. Mrs. E also returned from her South African safari, sharing incredible stories and photos that have further enriched our understanding of this topic.

In writing, students have been working on expository newspaper-style articles. They've faced the challenge of shifting from narrative storytelling to using factual language. The creative twist? They're turning small incidents from their holidays into catastrophized, large-scale dramas!

Additionally, we held a student-led vote, and we now have a new leadership team ready to take on the challenges of the final term of the year. A big thank you to our previous leaders, who have built a strong foundation for the class moving forward.

This term has kicked off with some intense revision of all learning covered over the year. Decimals combined with place value has been our primary focus this week with students being challenged to name, add, multiple and divide digits up to four decimal places.

Poetic writing through the form of song lyrics is what the students of Room 5 have been exploring this week. Songs such as 'Time of your Life' by Green Day and 'This is Home' by Troy Kingi and 'Count on Me' by Bruno Mars. Students have been thinking about the deeper meaning of words and emotions portrayed through the use of songwriting. This will be leading towards students writing their very own emotionally inspired lyrics that will be produced into a song using Ai.

 $\overset{-}{\text{L}}$ Humans sharing our world with animals is our Inquiry focus this term preparing us for a meaningful visit to the Hamilton Zoo during our camp experience in week 7. Animal testing for beauty products, pollution in our oceans and deforestation have been a number of big talking points in the classroom during this time. This learning will lead into animal conservation and the beautiful relationship between humans and animals and the extreme positive impact we can have on the animal kingdom. This week students have written Haiku's along with some extremely powerful responses to some thought provoking videos we have viewed.

Health and Physical Education

Athletic training is on the go as we head towards Interschools Athletics occurring in the very near future. A whole school rotation has been taking place each afternoon with all students mastering their skills in Relays, long jump, tug of war, sprints, shot put, discus and high jump.

This week we are very happy to have Whaea Kiara join our teaching team in Room 5 as she completes her final practicum before she enters the rewarding role of being an educator. Whaea Kiaras strength would be relating to all tamariki, being a world class swim instructor and te reo implementer and outstanding all round human who has enhanced the classroom culture from the moment she walked in.
