






SWIMMING SUCCESS

Focus - P.E.

We are continuing with reading for meaning and using texts in different ways to support our understanding.
When your child is reading at home, ask them questions about the book. Use questions that start with who, what, where, why and how.

We are starting a unit of descriptive writing. This encourages the students to use adverbs and adjectives in their writing, to paint a better picture for the reader.

Maths

For the next few weeks, the year 4's are working on addition and subtraction to 1000 with Mrs Goodson. The year 5's are working with me and we will be looking at addition and subtraction within 10,000.


